"Unless you are born anew, you cannot see the Kingdom of God." - Jesus (John 3:3)

"If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation." - Paul (2 Corinthians 5:17)

"The one sitting on the throne said, 'Look, I am making everything new!" - John (Revelation 21:5)

Spring is my favorite season in California. The hills are green. Poppies and lupine are shining forth their colorful faces. The birds are singing away as they build their nests. The rebirth of the natural world after winter is in full swing, and there is new growth everywhere.

I believe this rebirth and new life is a pattern written deep into the fabric of the universe. It is core to the way things exist, relate, and connect. It is, according to the quotes from Jesus, Paul, and John, (among many others) - core to who we are and what God is up to in our world and our lives.

Psychologists from Harvard did a study a few years ago where they asked 30-year-olds to look back and see how much they had changed over the last 10 years, and then to predict how much they thought they would change over the next 10. They reported that they had changed immensely over the previous 10 years, but didn't expect to change much over the next ten. They had felt like they had arrived at their true selves. The fascinating part of the study is that 40-year-olds reported the exact same thing. As did 50-year-olds. And 60-year-olds, too.

It turns out we are always in the process of becoming.

I believe this is God at work through the experiences we have and the choices we make, helping us to grow, develop, and mature. If we are willing to step into this continual process of rebirth, we find Spirit at work, helping our lives bear more love, more joy, more peace, more patience, more kindness, more gentleness.

Like Nicodemus, we each daily have the choice to rest on our past accomplishments and accrued expertise, or to be willing to become like children again, willing to learn; open to awe and wonder; curious about what we can learn and who we can become.

So in this season of spring, may you find God making new things in you.



Preschool Report

Our payroll has gone up 30% per month since September 2021 when we finally were able to hire enough staff to meet guidelines and enroll 72 children which we are licensed for.

We are going to increase our rates 8% in May to help offset our expenses. We also are going to convert the toddler room into a preschool classroom so we can expand the number of children we are licensed for without increasing staff. We hope to do this by August. Instead of enrolling children at 18 months, we would start children at 2 years old.

This week the preschool took individual and classroom photos of the children. Taking our own school photos has been one of our best fund raisers over the last few years.

In April the preschool will be selling pies and cobblers from The Pie Company. Orders are due April 29th and pies will be delivered May 7th for pick up. Contact Marilyn to order.
