## \* AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: The Confession of 1967 (part 3) (unison)

It is the will of God that the divine purpose for human life shall be fulfilled under the rule of Christ and all evil be banished from creation.

Biblical visions and images of the rule of Christ, such as a heavenly city, a father's house, a new heaven and earth, a marriage feast, and an unending day culminate in the image of the kingdom. The kingdom represents the triumph of God over all that resists God's will and disrupts creation. Already God's reign is present as a ferment in the world, stirring hope in humanity and preparing the world to receive its ultimate judgment and redemption.

With an urgency born of this hope, the church applies itself to present tasks and strives for a better world. It does not identify limited progress with the kingdom of God on earth, nor does it despair in the face of disappointment and defeat. In steadfast hope, the church looks beyond all partial achievement to the final triumph of God.

## PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

ONE: ... Pray for the peace of Jerusalem.

- ALL: We pray for peace in every nation— that people will turn their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks and study war no more.
- ONE: Pray for the peace of the church.
- ALL: We pray for peace in Christ's body— put an end to fear and fighting, and help us to proclaim in word and action the good news of salvation to all.
- ONE: Pray for the peace of this community.
- ALL: We pray for peace in this place— for safety in our homes and streets, for the prosperity of our neighbors, and for the health of family and friends.
